A Conversation with Peter Mele, Executive Director, The Northern Trust, and Joshua Sanchez TFTMNY Alum and Young Benefactor Executive Committee Member.

JS: The former PGA TOUR commissioner Tim Finchem inspired the development of The First Tee. How did the TOUR initially become involved?


PM: Once the chapter was launched here in NYC, it allowed our tournament to become involved by adding TFTMNY as one of our participating charities.

JS: TFTMNY has had a great impact since 2001 in large part through the support of the TOUR. What impact do you see the program having on the future success of students?

PM: One of the programs, Path to College, has been a huge success. The mentoring starts at a young age, helping to prepare students for college and the entire application process. It helps to make college attainable for students who may not have felt that to be an option for them.

JS: The PGA TOUR event designated the Chapter as an official charity and provided support. How did that come about and will that commitment continue?

PM: We truly believed in the mission of TFT and saw this as an opportunity to help better the lives of the young people in the area who became involved with the program. Our partnership with TFT of Metro NY has continued to grow and we plan to continue our support.







The PGA TOUR and Northern Trust announced that beginning in 2017, the Chicago-based global bank will become title sponsor of the FedExCup Playoffs tournament held annually in the New York/New Jersey area. The Northern Trust will be held at Glen Oaks Club in Old Westbury New York, just minutes from our Long Island First Tee facility, Eisenhower Park Golf Course.

Northern Trust's sponsorship is a five-year agreement that renames the tournament The Northern Trust and maintains its position as the opening event of the FedExCup Playoffs. Northern Trust Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Frederick H. Waddell said. "Now as we deepen our investments on the East Coast, we are excited to continue our partnership with the PGA TOUR by sponsoring a world class playoff event that supports our growing business and continued commitment to the communities we serve."





IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS





The GOLFWORKS program was founded by the MGA in 1994 to fund interns from disadvantaged backgrounds to work at area golf clubs. The mission has expanded since the inception of The First Tee to also include internships for advanced program participants who mentor and teach their peers, while also gaining work experience that reinforces life skills learned through this initiative. Morgan Stanley and TFTMNY joined in partnership in 2013 through the creation of the Morgan Stanley First Tee/GOLFWORKS Fellows program built on this youth internship model. Over the past three years, this program has provided funding for 75 fellowships with more than 80% of these students being from diverse backgrounds. This exciting partnership expansion will not only benefit the interns whose employment would be funded by Morgan Stanley's support, but also every child who is enrolled in The First Tee. The Fellows serve as role models for all participants in our program.

MGA... SO WE CAN PLAY!

What was the MGA's initial involvement with The First Tee of Metropolitan New York? The First Tee was a brand new national organization and along with the partnership with our friends at the Met PGA, we made a commitment to become involved with its development here in the metropolitan area. I remember looking at various locations with the late Lew Rudin. We looked at the Mosholu Golf Course in The Bronx and felt it had a lot of the ingredients we were looking for; a 9-hole golf course, the capacity to accommodate the teaching space and much more.



What did you envision the program would become? We wanted to envision the program growing as a full-service chapter serving kids throughout the entire metropolitan area – that was very important to the MGA. Over the years we've seen our outreach numbers grow, as well as the number of participants who have directly enrolled in our First Tee curriculum, and who specifically benefited from our Life Skills and Core Value programs.

How has the program grown over the last 16 years? I think we've seen smart growth; balancing growth in the number of facilities and kids we are reaching, while at the same time ensuring that each participant is getting a meaningful experience and introduction into the teachings of the First Tee - that's really important. We've also seen programs like Path to College develop and benefit our older participants.

Do you have a special memory of The First Tee? It's always impactful to interact directly with the kids and a good thing to hear the participants talk about their success. Two years ago I heard Mrs. Dawkins, a single mother, talk about the impact the First Tee program has had on her son Cameren's life and it was especially moving. It put everything in perspective and reinforced my belief that every day our programs are having a positive impact on the lives of young people.

"Fairways to the Future" Program Inspires Female Participants

TFTMNY partnered with Westchester Country Club (WCC) staff and members to host "Fairways to the Future", a program that teaches the importance of achieving goals and dreams on and off the golf course. Local female participants from the Mosholu-Montefiore Community Center Outreach Program (MMCC) and The Bronx/ Brooklyn First Tee attended three different outings and were invited to play on WCC's par 3 course.

Leadership Seminar

Our Winter Fitness Program raised nearly \$1,200 to fund a trip to Florida. The girls stopped at William & Mary College and NC State at Chapel Hill enroute to Disney, where they attended a leadership seminar. The group toured both the Golf Channel Facility and The World Golf Hall of Fame; and enjoyed a round of golf and lunch at Bay Hill Golf Course, as per an invitation from the legendary Arnold Palmer. As part of their "give back" program, the girls hosted a free introductory golf clinic for a small group of Girl Scouts in Central Florida.


(66 boys/30 girls) competed in different divisions, based on their First Tee Skill level. Trophies were awarded to the best scores at each of those level.
