


“Tommy’s Honour” Premiere Movie Event





Moshulu Participant Tyler Kim Soaks It All In at the PURE Insurance Championship at Pebble Beach Impacting The First Tee

Tyler Kim, 17, of Manhattan, represented The First Tee at the 2017 PURE Insurance Championship Tournament in September at Pebble Beach Golf Links and Poppy Hills Golf Course. The event was held by The First Tee and broadcasted live on the Golf Channel. Eighty-one First Tee junior golfers from around the country were each paired with a Champions Tour Professional and played a best-ball format with their Pro. Participants had the opportunity to mingle with other participants, event sponsors, businessmen, and local dignitaries. Tyler was paired with fellow New York native Joey Sindelar for the week. While Tyler admitted he was a little nervous on the first tee box, he used the Core Values of The First Tee to send one down the middle.

“Playing with Joey was such an incredible experience. He was so nice throughout the entire week and it was nice for me to be up close and see how an accomplished PGA Pro like Joey works his way around a golf course,” said Tyler.



Playing Pebble Beach was an experience in it of itself for Tyler because of its history and beauty. 
